

How You Communicate **Communication Suggestions** Ask very specific, concrete questions and avoid very broad questions. Before the Visit Ask mostly yes and no questions when possible. During the Visit Give me extra time to respond to questions. After the Visit Getting to Know You Read written notes that I bring to the visit. Your Supporters Give me examples of the types of things people may experience and let me tell you if I experience them too. Sharing the Report Show me lists of symptoms to choose from. **Report Preview** Help me answer questions about time by linking to important events in my life.

Remind me that it is OK to not know the answers to your questions.
 Remind me that it is OK not to be 100% exact in my answers.

I don't need accommodations to answer questions or give information.

I need accommodations to answer questions or give information, but they are **not listed** here.

Offer to reword the question if I seem confused.




